Request for Information: Freedom of Information Act

Thank you for your email of 3 October, making a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. You requested the following information and the Trust is able to provide the information below in response:

Request:

I would be very grateful for papers, reports or emails produced between January 1, 2015 - August 31, 2017 concerning the assessment of and/or identification of any land or buildings or facilities owned by Oxford Health NHS Trust in Oxfordshire that might be suitable for sale or disposal.

I would also be grateful for any papers, reports or emails giving estimates (whether rough or professionally determined) of the value or estimated value, of any such potentially disposable land/buildings/facilities during the same time.

Response:

Information published nationally contains such details, in the report called Register of the public sector surplus asset list which can be accessed via the following link

The information is therefore reasonably accessible, as is information from Board Papers below, and the Trust has applied section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act to this request.

If you are unhappy with the service you have received in relation to your request and wish to make a complaint or request a review of our decision, you should write to me and I will ensure the decision is reviewed. The Trust will consider undertaking a review if requested to do so within 40 working days of the date the response is received by the applicant, and will apply discretion if a longer period of time has passed.

Should you wish to make a complaint as a result of the outcome of such a review, you may apply directly to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) for a decision.

Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by the Trust for FoI Act matters.
