HAVE YOUR SAY: Warneford Park Consultation

As Trust members you may be aware that the Warneford Hospital is the oldest inpatient unit still in use across the NHS.

We have ambitious plans to replace the

hospital with a major brain health research and innovation campus at the existing Warneford Hospital site in Headington. This will comprise of a new state-of-the-art



mental health hospital, modern scientific facility and a new post-graduate college for the University of Oxford.

We are in the pre-application planning phase of this project and value your views in first public consultation that closes at the end of September. We would like local residents, organisations and key stakeholders to get involved and share their feedback, so that the plans for Warneford Park meet people's needs in the best way possible.

Alpaca walks in the Bucks countryside spell national success for Bucks Talking Therapies

Buckinghamshire Talking Therapies and Sport England have devised a mental health treatment which combines talking therapy and physical exercise, like countryside walks with alpacas.

People being treated for anxiety and depression by NHS Buckinghamshire Talking Therapies were invited to trial the new approach incorporating physical activity alongside talking therapy.

The approach is to be trialled nationwide by the NHS and Sport England.

Eight year alcohol-related dementia research awarded £2.4 million

Consultant psychiatrist at Oxford Health, Dr Anya Topiwala received a £2.4 million Wellcome Career Development Award, providing funding for eight years of research into alcoholrelated dementia. The significant

funding from the award will aim to identify the pathways by which alcohol leads to dementia.

New shingles vaccine could reduce risk of dementia

The new shingles vaccine 'Shingrix' is associated with a reduced risk of dementia.

According to a major new study



supported by Oxford Health Biomedical Research Centre (OH BRC) both the latest vaccine and the previous shingles vaccine offer protection again dementia.

However, evidence indicates the new shingles vaccine is more protective against dementia compared to the previous one.
